# The Reflection (required)

Discuss these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

- Let's look back at the entire After God series. Which week was the most meaningful to you, and why? When You're After God...
  - ... Your Heart is What Matters (1 Sam. 16:7)
  - ... You Move in Faith, Despite the Critics (1 Sam. 17:45b)
  - ... You Rest in Him in the Middle of Your Disaster (Psa. 57:1)
  - ... Worshipping Him is More Important Than Anything (2 Sam. 6:21-22)
  - ... Your Life is Marked by Undeserved Grace (2 Sam. 9:11b)
  - ... You Admit Your Sin and Humble Yourself (Psa. 51:7-8)
  - ... You Consider How Your Choices Impact Others (1 Chron. 21:6-7)
  - ... God is What Lasts When You're Gone (1 Chron. 28:9)
- David knew that the only thing that mattered after he was gone was his legacy of following after God's heart, so he shared three final instructions with his son Solomon. Read, then discuss what each means:
  - Know God Read 1 Chron. 28:9a & 1 Chron. 29:10-13
  - Serve God Read 1 Chron. 28:9b & 1 Chron. 29:14-17
  - Seek God Read 1 Chron. 28:9c & 1 Chron. 29:18-19
- These were David's instructions to Solomon, but Jesus has called us to do the same thing. Read then <u>discuss what each looks like for us today</u>:
  - Know God Read Matthew 22:37-38
  - Serve God Read John 13:12-17
  - Seek God Read Matthew 6:31-34
- What does God want you to do in response to the After God series?

## Main Passage: 1 Chronicles 28:9 (NLT)

And Solomon, my son, learn to know the God of your ancestors intimately. Worship and serve him with your whole heart and a willing mind. For the Lord sees every heart and knows every plan and thought. If you seek him, you will find him. But if you forsake him, he will reject you forever.

# 1 Chronicles 29:10-19\*too long to print, read full passage in Bible

### Matthew 22:37-38 (NIV)

Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment".

### John 13:12-17 (NLT)

After washing their feet, he put on his robe again and sat down and asked, "Do you understand what I was doing? You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and you are right, because that's what I am. And since I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash each other's feet. I have given you an example to follow. Do as I have done to you. I tell you the truth, slaves are not greater than their master. Nor is the messenger more important than the one who sends the message. Now that you know these things, God will bless you for doing them."

# Matthew 6:31-34 (NLT)

"So don't worry about these things, saying, 'What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear?' These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need. So don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring its own worries. Today's trouble is enough for today."
