The Repeats (required)

The Reflection (required)

Discuss these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

- What are some Bible verses that you have heard used out of context, that have been cropped to make it say what someone wants?
- Read Philippians 4:13 only. How have you heard this verse used?
- Read Philippians 4:11-14. In context, what does verse 13 teach?
- Why do you think it's important to study the Bible in context? What are the advantages? What are the problems if we don't use context?
- This passage teaches that God will help us in our hardships. How does that encourage you?
- Take a moment to review these verses from the Point <u>and discuss how</u> <u>they relate to Philippians 4:13</u>. In hardship, we need to remember:
 - Genesis 39:20-21: God is Present in Our Troubles
 - Romans 5:6: God is Perfect in His Timing
 - 2 Corinthians 12:7b-10: God is Powerful in Our Weakness
- Which of these is the most comforting for you and why?
- Go around the room and have each person share which of these three promises they <u>need to remember in times of hardship</u> (which may be right now!). As each person shares, assign someone else to pray for that person at the end. Close with a prayer time, having the assigned people pray for the others either silently or out loud.

The References

Main Passage: Philippians 4:11-14 (NIV84)

I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. <u>I can do everything through him who gives me</u> <u>strength</u>. Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles.

Genesis 39:20-21 (NIV)

Joseph's master took him and put him in prison, the place where the kings' prisoners were confined. But <u>while Joseph was there in the prison</u>, <u>the Lord was with him</u>; he showed him kindness and granted him favor in the eyes of the prison warden.

<u>Romans 5:6 (NIV)</u>

You see, <u>at just the right time</u>, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly.

2 Corinthians 12:7b-10 (NIV)

Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for <u>my power is made perfect in weakness</u>." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. <u>For</u> <u>when I am weak, then I am strong</u>.
