The Point:

LESS OF me MEANS MORE Speaking the Truth

 Have you ever done something crazy when sledding, skiing, or at the pool or beach (or similar recreational activity)? Tell us your story.

The Reflection (required) <u>Discuss</u> these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

- Read Matthew 3:7. Why was it such a big deal that John said this? Though it may not sound like it, how did this demonstrate his humility?
- Read Matthew 3:8-12. What was the issue with the Pharisees and Sadducees—what were they doing wrong? (see v. 8) Have you ever found yourself like that: saying the "right" things but not living it?
- In this passage, John demonstrated the importance of putting our insecurities, pride, and comfort behind, in order to speak truth to one another by saying the hard things. Why is "confrontation" so important? Why do you think it is hard for people to do this (appropriately)?
- As Christ-followers, the Bible gives us some descriptions of how to say
 the hard things. As you read each of the following, come up with examples that are opposite of what each passage describes:
 - Be Biblical: 2 Timothy 3:14-17
 - Be Gentle: Galatians 6:1; Ephesians 4:15
 - Be Specific: Matthew 18:15
 - Be Encouraging: 1 Thessalonians 5:14
 - Be Immediate: Hebrews 3:13
 - and Point to Jesus!:1 Corinthians 6:9-11
- We ALL have areas that we need to adjust in our lives, so that we're not just saying, but living like Jesus (Matt 3:8). Don't be overwhelmed, but share just one "opposite" just discussed, that sounds the most like you. What one practical thing can you do to begin to change this?

...gently and humbly help that person back onto the right path...

Ephesians 4:15 (NLT)
