The Reflection (required)

Discuss these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

Since this series is unique, we're going to pick a few "point in time" verses to examine and discuss from the lives of the kings and prophets.

Solomon:

- Read 1 Kings 9:1-5; 10:23-24. Describe the early life and kingship of Solomon.
- Read 1 Kings 11:1-4. What do this teach us about the importance of finishing strong? What does this mean about our past...good or bad?

Rehoboam of Judah:

- Read 1 Kings 12:3-14. What does Rehoboam fail to do here? What does this teach about the voices that are speaking into our lives?
- Is there anyone that you need to add or remove to your "advisors"?

Jehoram of Judah:

- Read 2 Chronicles 21:12-20. Aside from the punishment from God, what is so harsh about v. 20? What does this teach us about legacy?
- What do you want people to say about you when you're gone?

Azariah (Uzziah) of Judah:

- Read 2 Chronicles 26:16-20. According to the law of God, only priests were allowed to burn incense in the temple. With that in mind, why do you think that the word "courageous/brave" is used to describe the priests (v. 17)? How does pride (v. 16) lead us to disobey?
- Close by praying about areas where our pride is causing us to disobey

The References

Main Passage: 1 Kings 12:20 (NLT)

When the people of Israel learned of Jeroboam's return from Egypt, they called an assembly and made him king over all Israel. So only the tribe of Judah remained loyal to the family of David [Rehoboam].

- 1 Kings 9:1-5*too long to print, read passage in Bible
- 1 Kings 10:23-24*too long to print, read passage in Bible
- 1 Kings 11:1-4 (NIV)*selected verses, read full passage in Bible
-his heart was not fully devoted to the Lord his God, as the heart of David his father had been.
- 1 Kings 12:3-14* too long to print, read passage in Bible
- 2 Chronicles 21:12-20 (NIV)*selected verses, read full passage in Bible
- ...Jehoram was thirty-two years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem eight years. He passed away, to no one's regret, and was buried in the City of David, but not in the tombs of the kings.
- 2 Chronicles 26:16-20 (NIV)*selected verses, read full passage in Bible

But after Uzziah became powerful, his pride led to his downfall. He was unfaithful to the Lord his God, and entered the temple of the Lord to burn incense on the altar of incense. Azariah the priest with eighty other courageous priests of the Lord followed him in. They confronted King Uzziah...
