The Point: Shocking Truth: Fear Doesn't Fix Things Luke 12:25

Facing Anger in the Face

•**Read Luke 12:25**. What stood out to you from this week's Point? (they can be funny, serious, stupid, or spiritual)

•This week's point is "Fear doesn't fix things," and when we talk about fear we also mean synonyms such as worry, stress, and being anxious. Mark Driscoll explained fear in all shapes and sizes. What kind of impact does fear and stress have on people's lives both physically and emotionally? Who or what do you think influences fear in people's lives?

•Mark made a few statements throughout his message that are compelling, but maybe not fully understood. Let's discuss those statements.

What do you think Mark meant when he said...

- ... fear is vision without hope.
- ... fear is not rational, but it is powerful.
- ...fear is sometimes not getting what we want.
- ...fear preaches a false gospel.
- ... fear causes Christians to be false prophets.

•What was the thing that you feared most or stressed over most as a child? What are some of the tings that you fear most or stress over the most now? (Here are some examples: fear of actual things or people, fear of criticism, fear of losing a job, being a people pleaser, giving in easily to peer pressure, fear of having enough...) What drives are fears and do they seem inescapable at times? Why?

•Mark mentioned that fear is mentioned a lot in the Bible. Why do you think that is? Do you believe that fear represents a lack of trust in God? Why or why not?

•Read Psalm 23. David writes in this psalm that he will not fear even during the toughest times because he trusts in God. How can trusting God apply to eliminating the different types of fears and stress that we've already talked about?

•Just before Jesus ascended into heaven He gave His command to His disciples of what to do when He leaves. Jesus then leaves them with this statement: **Read Matthew 28:20b.** Why do you think that Jesus made this clear to His disciples?

•Read Isaiah 41:10. Mark shared a story about his 2-3 year old son that was afraid to travel to Scotland because his son thought he was making the journey on his own, but Mark's son's demeanor changed completely when he knew that his daddy was going to be with him all the way. In Isaiah, God promised Israel that He will be with them always and He has promised His church the same. He is our Father.

•Does it always feel like God is with you?

•Do you think that God is sometimes not with us? Why or why not?

•What is the difference between the times that you feel God is with you and the times that you don't? How do you think you can help make that more consistent in your life?

•What is one action that you think you can take to remove fear in your life?

Thinking Outside the Box

•Here's a thought for you: How do you create fear in other people's lives and what do you need to do to change that? Note: Answer this for yourself personally rather than for someone else in the room! ©

•**Read II Timothy 1:7.** How do you think what Paul writes here to Timothy applies to the fears we struggle with and fears we cause others?
