



The Point: Remain Real. Even if it makes you vulnerable........

Galatians 1:10

MC3 Core Value: Authenticity

Discussion Generators

- What are two things that stood out to you from this week's Point? (they can be silly, serious, stupid, or spiritual)
- According to what Paul says in Galatians 1:10, a person that follows Christ should be focused on winning God's approval and not people's approval otherwise he would have been faking it and going through the motions. What are your first thoughts and feelings about how a person reacts when they think about winning God's approval over people's?
- Have you ever heard the saying, "Perception is Reality." Do you think most people are perceived accurate to who they really are or do you think that a lot of people go through life wearing masks? Please explain. Vulnerable is one word to describe how a lot of people would feel about letting others see the real them. How else would you describe it?
- How would you describe a person that would be considered authentic? Why would it be important for someone confessing to be a Christ follower to authentic?

• Read Psalms 13 after describing King David the author. King David was considered a man after God's own heart and chosen by God to be the king of Israel. (Leaders, please add your own flare for describing David as well.) After reading this song written by King David, do you think that King David had doubt in the midst of his belief? Do you believe people often feel that same way? Why? What does Psalm 13 tell you about having doubt and belief at the same time?

Discussion Generators

• John 4:5-26 tells us of Jesus' interaction with the Samaritan woman at the well. Now this is significant because of how the Jews and Samaritans felt about one another.....(Leaders elaborate on the relationship between the Jews and Samaritans) Now once you understand the mix of how unlikely it was for Jesus as a Jew to be talking to any Samaritan woman, look at verses 15-18 to gain some more insight into this woman's life. What is your first reaction when you find out this info about her? What are your thoughts about Jesus offering eternal life to someone that would have been considered bottom of the barrel in those day especially to a Jew? What does this tell you about who Jesus is interested in sharing His message with? How does that apply to people today and to us?

• How do you feel about going to the doctor? Have you ever known anyone to go to a doctor and not tell them what all is going on because they really didn't want the diagnosis or the potential follow up they might have to have? With that in mind, how do you think a believer in Christ would apply I John 1:7-9?

As we continue discussing together about putting action to faith, again the GO series, how does talking about changing the way we approach "doing church" apply to the other five specific topics? Just as a reminder, the 1st week he talked about Grace (caring for others), the 2nd week he talked about Follow (as a disciple of Christ), the 3rd week he talked about Share (our faith and beliefs), the 4th week we talked about Give (Outrageous generosity), and the 5th week we talked about Change (Change consistently). How does talking about keeping it real and authentic apply to the previous five weeks?

Thinking Outside the Box

Thinking inside of what you know to step outside to the realm of possibilities:
Read the brief article excerpt from "Being Honest With God About My Feelings" and then ask the question: What do you want to say to the God who accepts you completely, along with all your doubts and confusion? (Ask participants to write this down for themselves and only to share with the group if they feel comfortable)
