Discussion Generators

- •What is one of your favorite childhood memories related to Christmas? What do you like most about Christmas now as an adult?
- •Read John 1:1-4. What stood out to you from this week's Point? (they can be funny, serious, stupid, or spiritual)
- •Who is John referring to as the Word here in John 1? What does verse 1 tell us about Jesus? Why would that be important?
- •What does verse 3 tell us about Jesus? Do you think that is important? Why or why not?
- •What does verse 4 tell us about Jesus? Does anyone know what that means?
- •Read John 1:14. According to what John says here, what was the point of Jesus becoming human?
- •Read Colossians 1:15-20. What Paul writes here basically restates what we are already discussing, but with a slightly different perspective. When we stop and think about God/Jesus becoming human what is unique and important about that in your mind?

- •What was one of the most meaningful gifts that you ever received? What did that gift tell you about the person that gave it to you in relation to you?
- •When we stop and think about God sending Jesus to us as a human for the purpose that He did, what does that tell us about Him in relation to us? Let's look at some verses in relation to that.
- •Read Hebrews 4:15-16. What do you take away from these two verses about God in relation to us?
- •Read II Corinthians 5:24. According to this verse what was God's desire for us by giving us Jesus?
- •Merry Christmas- Now What? This series is intended for us to stop and think about what is behind that phrase "Merry Christmas." Knowing what we now know through the point and our discussion tonight, does anything change in your mind when you hear that phrase?

Bible Verses

John 1:1-4 (NIV)

1.) In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2.) He was with God in the beginning. 3.) Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4.) In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

John 1:14 (CEV)

The Word became a human being and lived here with us. We saw His true glory, the glory of the only Son of the Father. From Him the complete gifts of undeserved grace and truth have come down to us.

Colossians 1: 15-20 (NLT)
