## Discussion Questions

- What are two things that stood out to you from this week's Point? (they
  can be silly, serious, stupid, or spiritual)
- [see Thinking Outside the Box below for a good opener]
- When you consider Paul's "pedigree" (Phil. 4:4b-6), what things do people today think makes them worthy of "special treatment"?
- Where do you find it hardest to put others first: work, school, church, or home? Why?
- What factors lead us to think that we should be first (i.e., selfish)?
- Often we will make excuses for not using our resources for anyone but ourselves. Discuss Matthew 25:14-30 as it relates to "our" resources.
- Take a moment to share what you've learned with your group: what are some things that you do to help you remember to put others first?
- What person with whom you've interacted in the last week (family member, co-worker, client, bus driver, waitress) would call you selfish?
- What is your "me" moment? Where do you need to stop making excuses and think of others first? Be specific.

## Thinking Outside the Box

## Bible References

Romans 12:3(NIV) <sup>3</sup>For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you.

**Philippians 2:3(NIV84)** <sup>3</sup>Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves.

James 4:1-3(NIV) <sup>1</sup>What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? <sup>2</sup>You desire but do not have, so you kill. You covet but you cannot get what you want, so you quarrel and fight. You do not have because you do not ask God.<sup>3</sup> When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.

Philippians 3:4b-8(NLT) <sup>4</sup>I Indeed, if others have reason for confidence in their own efforts, I have even more! <sup>5</sup>I was circumcised when I was eight days old. I am a pure-blooded citizen of Israel and a member of the tribe of Benjamin—a real Hebrew if there ever was one! I was a member of the Pharisees, who demand the strictest obedience to the Jewish law. <sup>6</sup>I was so zealous that I harshly persecuted the church. And as for righteousness, I obeyed the law without fault. <sup>7</sup>I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done. <sup>8</sup>Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ!

1 Peter 4:10(NIV) <sup>10</sup> Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.
