The Point: When You See Deficiency, God Sees Design!

Romans 12:4-8

Discussion Questions

- What are two things that stood out to you from this week's Point? (they
 can be silly, serious, stupid, or spiritual)
- Who did you look up to or want to be when you were a child? Why?
- Based on Psalm 139:13-16, when we are not satisfied with how we are made or gifted, what does that say about God? Why?
- Jeremiah's ministry was considered to be one of the hardest found in the Bible. In fact, it was so difficult that he is known as the "Weeping Prophet". Read Jeremiah 1:4-8. How does this affect your understanding of God's plan and design?
- Have you ever broken a bone or lost function in a part of your body?
 What happened? How did you learn to adjust?
- What leads us to act like some gifts are "superior" to others? Why?
- How does 1 Cor. 12:12-26 affect our view of our gifts compared to others? Why?
- According to these passages, who suffers when we don't use our gifts?
- What do you feel your spiritual gift(s) are? Are you using them for God's glory? Or for yourself (think "funhouse mirror")? Or not at all?
- What one thing can you do to change that?

Thinking Outside the Box

It's time for a creative exercise:

There is a crowded room of people and each person has one of the spiritual gifts found in Romans 12:6-8. Suddenly, someone in the room trips and spills their 15-layer cheese dip on the floor! Aside from some wasted dip, how does each person respond? Explain or, better yet, act out how each person's gift would react in that situation. Have fun!!

Bible References

Romans 12:4-8(NIV) ⁴ For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. ⁶ We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith, ⁷ if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach, ⁸ if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

Romans 12:6b-7a(MSG) So since we find ourselves fashioned into all these excellently formed and marvelously functioning parts in Christ's body, ⁶ let's just go ahead and be what we were made to be, without enviously or pridefully comparing ourselves with each other, or trying to be something we aren't.

Psalm 139:13-16(NIV) ¹³ For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. ¹⁴ I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. ¹⁵ My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. ¹⁶ Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.

Jeremiah 1:4-8(NIV) ⁴ The word of the Lord came to me[Jeremiah], saying, ⁵ "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations." ⁶ "Alas, Sovereign Lord," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am too young." ⁷ But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am too young.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. ⁸ Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the Lord.
