## The Reflection (required)Discuss these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

• If you rode a bus as a child, share your best "school bus story"?

- •Before we look at revenge in *our* lives, it's important that we establish some things about Jesus. Read these passages, then discuss:
  - Jesus Felt the Pain! Read Luke 23:33; Philippians 2:7; John 1:14a. Why is it important for us that Jesus—being fully human (and fully God)—felt real pain? How does this add depth to His forgiveness?
  - Jesus Had the Power! Read Matthew 26:50-53. How does this remove excuses for taking revenge? How does it add *more* depth?
  - Jesus Had the Right! Read Luke 23:13-16. According to this would it have been wrong for Jesus to call on those angels? Again, how does His actual innocence add depth to His forgiveness?
    Jesus Forgave. Read Luke 23:34a. With all of the above as back-
  - ground, what is Jesus showing us about forgiveness here?

•Now that we have seen Jesus' example of forgiveness over revenge, let's look at how it matters in *our* lives: *Don't Throw Under The Bus* 

- Even If You're in Pain ... because God is always up to something!
  - •Read Genesis 37:12-28 & 50:14-21. Why does pain tend to push us toward revenge? How did God uses Joseph's pain?
- •Even If You Have the Power ... because God's way is always better!
  - •Read 1 Samuel 24:1-21. What might we miss by "taking matters into your own hands"? Does "I can" always mean that "I should"?
- Even If You Have the Right ... because you will stand out!
- Read Matthew 5:38-45 & 5:16. What was allowed by Jewish law here? Why would giving up our right to revenge stand out?
  Just. Forgive. ...because you may change a life!
  - •Read Romans 12:17-21. How can forgiveness "overcome evil"? Why doesn't revenge satisfy? Would forgiveness be easier if you knew that it would lead that person to Jesus? <u>What if it DOES</u>?
