The Reflection (required)

Discuss these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

- •In the Point we saw that Moses, the one who delivered the nation of Israel, was also a murderer. Most of us probably don't struggle with being tempted to murder, however, Jesus ups the standard. Read Matthew 5:21-22. What did Jesus say was equivalent to murder?
- •Since the Point was a bit shorter than normal with the c3 Pastor Candidate story, let's look deeper at what the Bible says about anger:
 - Anger is Unbiased Read Ephesians 4:26 and Mark 3:5.
 - •How can anger be "sinless"? How can anger lead to sin?
 - Anger is Ungodly Read James 1:19-20.
 - •If anger is neutral, why do you think James says this in v. 20? What's the difference between us & Jesus? Thinking back to last week's Point, how do we <u>deceive</u> ourselves related to this?
 - Anger is Uncontrolled Read Proverbs 15:18.
 - •Justified or not, what does Solomon explain about anger?
 - Anger is Unloving Read 1 Corinthians 13:5.
 - •In this well-known passage about love, why does Paul include this about anger? What does it mean to be "easily angered"?
- •Which of the above is your biggest struggle when it comes to anger?
- •Despite Moses' murder, God still used him! Have your group explain these passages of what God did *after* Moses killed the Egyptian:
 - God Chose His Leader in Moses Read Exodus 3:1-10
 - God Revealed His Name to Moses Read Exodus 3:13-15
 - God Showed His Glory to Moses Read Exodus 33:18-23
 - God Shared His Transfiguration with Moses Read Mark 9:2-8
- *B-Sides* is all about God using people despite their failures, so each week we're going to ask a similar question: How does God using Moses despite his murder, make you feel about God in *your* life?
- •Close by praying that God would help us control our anger and thanking Him that He still uses us when we don't!
