The Reflection (required) Discuss these to go deeper, and more personal, into applying the Point

- •Do you have any unusual family traditions that once had a purpose?
- Read Exodus 23:19, Leviticus 11:3-11, Leviticus 19:19, & Deuteronomy 22:9-11. First of all, did you know that these were in the Bible?
- Have you heard verses, like these, used to discredit the Bible? How?
- •To whom were these laws directed? [i.e., Old Covenant or New?]
- •From the Point on Sunday, why were each of these rules included?
- •Since these laws are written for Israel, for a specific purpose at the time, there are principles that can apply to us as Christ-followers:
 - Stand Out (see 1 Peter 2:9-12; Romans 12:2)
 - •What are the benefits of "standing out" for Jesus?
 - •Share multiple, specific ways that we can do this[i.e., Application]
 - Show Trust (see Romans 12:1; 1 Peter 1:13-16)
 - •Why is obedience to God necessary? How can we do this?
 - Stay Pure (see 2 Corinthians 6:14-7:1)
 - •Why isn't "close enough" or "almost pure", good enough for God?
 - •Why are we so likely to blur the lines between right and wrong?
 - •What are ways that we can "not blend fabrics" today?
- •As you consider these 3 above, which is the most important to you?
- •Which one are you most likely to ignore or make excuses about?
