## The Reflection (required) <u>Discuss</u> these to go deeper, *and more personal*, into applying the Point

- Have you used a tool for something other than its intended purpose?
- In the first part of the Point, we looked at various Bible passages that appeared to "prove" that the Bible is wrong. You can listen to or watch that at <a href="mailto:mc3Church.org/Cropped2">mc3Church.org/Cropped2</a>. Rather than go into specific passages, we're going to use our time to discuss <a href="foundational principles">foundational principles</a> to consider when it appears that the Bible and science conflict. [Please take your time to <a href="mailto:chew">chew</a> through these questions; <a href="mailto:ask "why?"</a>]
  - God is Unknown! Read Romans 11:33-36; 1 Corinthians 2:16
    - •What do these passages mean? Be honest: does it bother you that you can't know everything about God? Why?
    - •What would it mean if we could understand God?
  - God is Involved! Read Hebrews 1:3; Colossians 1:15-17
    - •What do most sciences assume about God's involvement?
    - •How do these passage speak to that? Take a moment to list <u>observations</u> that you see *about God* in these two passages.
  - God is Supreme! Read 2 Pet.1:20-21; 2 Tim.3:16-17; Heb.4:12
    - •In the Point, Sean said "When science and the Bible disagree, don't assume that the Bible is wrong". Why do you think <u>Christfollowers</u> tend to do that? What do these verses say about that?
    - •Is it naïve to trust God when things don't "line up"? Why/not?
  - God is Alive! Read Acts 17:24-28a; John 20:30-31
    - •According to these verses, what is God's purpose for "the Bible"?
    - •How do you *feel* about the idea that the Bible is not designed as a science book? Have you ever heard that before?
    - •If this is true, what is the most important thing that we "confront" our world about? Is it "proving" the Bible? If not, what then?
- •When have <u>you</u> gotten sidetracked by focusing on "fighting back" against the culture, rather than focusing on sharing Jesus?
- •What do you need to change so that that doesn't happen again?
- •What has this discussion/Point taught you about your faith in Jesus?
