RUINED!

When You're Ruined!, Your Response Shapes Your Recovery

The Repeats (required)

They are the same, but *WE* change, so <u>please</u> <u>discuss</u> these with your group

- [Share the announcements (on FB thread) with your group]
- Welcome back to Pr'me Groups! Remember, we're going to open by sharing God Moments about what He is doing in our lives, but <u>save</u> our prayer requests for the END of Pr'me. •This Week's Bible Passage & Focus Verse: Job 1:1-2:10 "I came naked from my mother's womb, and I will be naked when I leave. The LORD gave me what I had, and the LORD has taken it away. Praise the name of the LORD!" (Job 1:21, NLT)

The Reflection (required) <u>Discuss</u> these to go deeper, *and more personal*, into applying the Point

- •If you were in a TV interview, would you rather ask a "stupid question" (with an obvious answer), or give a "stupid answer"? Why?
- •Before this series started, what did you know about Job?
- We'll get into this in later weeks, but, for now, does it surprise you to hear that Job is not about "why do bad things happen?", but about "how will we respond?" Why/not? What does Job 1:8-12 add?
- •Read **Job 1:20-22**. How did Job *respond* when he lost his family and possessions? How do <u>you feel</u> about his response here? Why?
- •What does Colsns. 1:16-17, Hebrews 1:3, & James 1:16-17 add?
- •Read Job 2:9-10. How did Job *respond* when his health was taken away? How do <u>you feel</u> about his response this time? Why?
- •What does John 16:33 & John 15:18-20 add?
- •In what ways—good OR bad—can our response affect/shape our recovery when we go though a difficult time? Why?
- •Read, then contrast each of these Bible characters' responses to ruin:
 - •King Saul (1 Samuel 18:6-11) VS. Joseph (Genesis 50:15-21)
 - Pharaoh (Exodus 14:5-9) VS. Silas (& Paul) (Acts 16:22-25)
 - Jonah (Jonah 4:5-11) VS. Paul (Philippians 4:4)
- •Which one of these is your most common response when faced with ruin? What can help you respond in a way that honors God?
