•This Week's Bible Passage & Focus Verse: Ephesians 6:1-3 If you honor your father and mother, "things will go well for you, and you will have a long life on the earth." (v. 3, NLT)

The Reflection (required) <u>Discuss</u> these to go deeper, *and more personal*, into applying the Point

- •Bridges. Have you seen a cool one up close, or had a scary or funny moment on one, or built one for school? Tell us your story.
- As a child of parents (which we ALL are!), we need to honor them:
 Based on 1 Timothy 4:12, we need to reflect on our own hearts first. Why does this matter? How can *you* do this?
 - •No parent is perfect. *How* can we honor/respect/obey them, even though they're flawed? (see **Ephesians 6:1-3; Colossians 3:20**)
 - •Based on **Proverbs 1:8** & **6:20-23**, how can children respond to the truth of what their parents say? What does this look like?
 - •One final way that we can honor our parents is by repaying their work (see 1 Timothy 5:4). Share some ways that this can happen.
- •As a church we need to come alongside children of all ages to help them build bridges to their parents. Consider ways we can do that:
 - •Based on Galatians 6:2 do you find it easy or hard to enter into the mess of other's broken relationships with their kids/parents? Why?
 - •Why <u>must</u> *pleasing Jesus* be the foundation for building bridges between children & parents? (see **Colossians 3:20b** & **Galatians 1:10**)
 - •How can we unintentionally <u>dis</u>honor parents (see **Matt. 15:3-7**)? What are ways that we can *actively* encourage honoring parents?
 - •Hebrews 12:14-15 says it is <u>our</u> responsibility as the church to help others build bridges in their relationships. Share examples of what this could look like either from your own life or hypothetically.
