## **The Reflection** (required) <u>Discuss</u> these to go deeper, *and more personal*, into applying the Point

- •Look around you right now—what things do you see that are symbols, representing/reminding us of something else?
- •Share one specific thing you learned about communion in the Point.
- •God designed communion as a symbol to remember Jesus' death.
  - •To get us on the same page, what are the 2 elements in communion?
  - What do each of these things represent, symbolically?
- Communion has its roots in the OT Passover (or *Seder*) meal. While Sean touched on some of this during the Point, let's go a bit deeper into the connections between the Passover and Jesus. Have <u>everyone</u> open Exodus 12:1-51. *Also*, assign people to read these passages:
  Read 1 Corinthians 5:7; John 1:29; Revelation 5:11-13. What in
  - the Passover is symbolic of Jesus from these passages (be specific)? •What does it mean that Jesus is our Passover lamb?
  - •Read Hebrews 9:14; 1 Peter 1:18-19. What in the Passover is symbolic of Jesus from these passages (be specific)?
  - •What does it mean that Jesus was "unblemished"?
  - •Read John 19:31-36. What in the Passover is symbolic of Jesus from this passage (be specific)?
  - •Why is this simple fact so powerful as it ties Jesus to the Passover?
  - Read Romans 5:9; Ephesians 1:7; 1 Peter 2:24. What in the Passover is symbolic of Jesus' blood from these passages (be specific)?
    As you reflect on the Passover, why does Jesus' blood matter to us?
- According to Heb. 11:28, what was required of <u>the Israelites</u> to be saved? According to Eph. 2:8-9, what is required of <u>us</u> to be saved?
  Have <u>you</u> made that decision to trust Jesus by faith?
- In 1 Cor. 11:27-29, we are told to reflect on why we take communion. In light of all that we've discussed, what does this mean?
  What would this look like for *you* the next time we take communion?
